Now we are enjoying some warmer weather, please ensure your children are adequately prepared! Grey shorts / green gingham summer dresses / playsuits can be worn if you wish. Every child should have a refillable water bottle (containing only water – no squash / juice please) every day. Children should also bring a NAMED sun hat to school each day. Please put the "all-day" / long-lasting sun-cream on children in the morning before school as school staff cannot possibly apply sun-cream to all 450 children! If children have hay fever, please give anti-

histamines before school – we can only administer prescription medication in school with a signed consent form. Thank you for your understanding.

Next Friday, 17th May is our May Fayre! All events will be on the Key Stage Two playground with the gates re-opening at 4pm. There will be a mixture of stalls, games, hot food, cakes, drinks, a licensed bar and an ice-cream van! Most stalls are cash but the ice-cream van and the PTA also have a card reader which can be used. Our children are also singing and dancing during the fayre and it would be wonderful to have as many families as possible supporting the PTA in this fundraiser and social event.

Smartphones / online use

We continue to see a worrying number of incidents relating to children using smart phones and / or the internet inappropriately. This is really damaging to children's mental health and well-being and it is parents' responsibility to monitor this vigilantly at home. Please see the attached one page report from Ofcom regarding this important issue and some recent staistics, some of which I am sure you will agree are worrying. Sometimes parents / carers need to be the "bad guy" with regard to monitoring and limiting screen-time in order to protect children for the long-term.

Our current school policy is that only Year Six children can bring their phones to school (as a Y6 privilege) and leave them in a pouch in the office all day. We do not have the facilities to look after a phone for every child who owns one.

The children have been invited in for a free breakfast from 8:30am each day and we are sure every child will do their personal best – which is all we ask!
