



Eggcellent Egg Drop Competition

As it is Science week this week, we are challenging you to complete the

Eggcellent Egg Drop challenge!

The challenge is to create a container that will protect an egg from cracking or breaking from a high fall*.

- The most important thing is to keep your egg safe so you will need to use materials that you think will protect it from the impact of the fall!
- **Creativity is also very important** – winning entries need to look good as well as keeping your egg safe!

*You will need your adult to drop/help drop your egg from a height – we recommend doing it from a standing position on a table top (inside or outside the house).

Equipment and materials you may use:

Felt pens/pencils, scissors, tape/glue, cardboard, straws, cardboard tubes, paper, lolly sticks, tissue/kitchen towel, plastic/paper bags, recyclable materials (items from your recycling box), string/wool, balloons, cotton wool, washing-up cloths/sponges.

Items that you cannot use:

Soft toys, pillows/cushions/blankets, items of clothing, bubble wrap.
