Dear Parents and Carers,

Y6 SATs week has finished and we are incredibly proud of all of the children for their focused, mature and determined attitude to complete each test to the very best of their ability. Despite having two years of interrupted education and not having covered as much of the curriculum as previous cohorts, our Year 6 children approached every test with the Self-Belief and a determination for Excellence which has been instilled within them throughout their time here at EBPS.

The tests have all now been packaged up and sent away for marking, however regardless of the results and the outcome, we are truly proud of our Year 6 children. Tests only ever measure a tiny proportion of the curriculum and of what we value and endeavour to teach our children. The other things we value such as our school values of Kindness, Honesty, Respect as well as other traits such as creativity, teamwork, resilience, empathy confidence and just being an all-round decent human-being are not measured by SATs but are equally as important. Well done Year 6 and enjoy the rest of your time with us in Primary school: Leavers' show, residential and lots more wonderful learning opportunities!

Next week and into the week after, our Year 2 children complete their SATs test to mark the end of their time in Key Stage One. We are keeping this very low-key with the children, they believe they are carrying out "Special Agent Training – SAT"! The children will complete their reading, writing and maths tests in classrooms or small groups in the usual way, just working in silence for each test. We do not want children to be unduly stressed or worried by these tests at all!

The results of all statutory tests and assessments will be reported to parents in the end of year report.

Thank you to those who have made an extra effort with punctuality this week. Throughout the week we had 25 lates before the registers closed and 28 lates after the registers closed (which is classed as a full morning of absence). Attendance this week is 94.04%, which is not an improvement on last week.

School gates open at 8.30am, classroom doors open at 8.45am. A reminder that if your child arrives at school after 8.55am, they will be required to sign in late at the school office. If they arrive after 9.00am, they will be registered as late after the registers close. In this case they are recorded as absent for the whole morning session. If this happens more than ten times in any six-week period parents may receive a penalty notice from the County Council.

Penalty notices are also issued by the County Council for term-time holidays over five days.

In cases of persistent lateness and term-time holidays an initial fixed penalty notice of £60 is issued to each parent for each child (so a two-parent family with two children would be fined £240). Information and support from the County Council for attendance issues can be found [here](#).
